

General Nadaſti ſent in to Prince Charles's Quarters a young Girl of between 14 and 15 Years of Age, in Man's Cloaths, whom the Pruffians had made uſe of as a Spy. She confeſſed that ſhe had been ordered to inform herſelf of the Number of Huſſars and Uhlans who were at Aujeſt, and whether Count Nadaſti's Corps was ſtrong: She will be confin'd in the Houſe of Correction at Prague. The Huſſars who had paſſed the Elbe beyond Jaromirz, made four Running-Footmen Priſoners, amongſt whom there is one belonging to the Marquis de Valori, and have brought them to Prince Charles's Quarters.

Two of them had laid a Wager, which ſhould arrive firſt at the King's Quarters at Cholm, and the two others had ran with them to judge and decide who won. This Afternoon Lieutenant General Count Collowrath and Major General Hartſch, paſſed the Adler with five Battalions of Auſtrians, and encamped on the Left of the Mountain of the Crcats, upon which a Battery of four Pieces of Cannon has juſt been erected.

Upon the 30th, by the Reports of the Pruſſian Deſerters who came in, the King had relieved Ziethen's Regiment of Huſſars by Rothembourg's Dragoons; and by other Accounts, the greateſt Part of his Huſſars were to encamp behind the Metau, between Jaromirz and Neuſtadt, in order to preſerve the Communication with the County of Glatz.

Copenhagen, July 31, N. S. The Princeſs Royal of Denmark has already begun to receive the Ladies who come to pay their Court to her. The King of Sweden is expected this Day at Helſingbourg.

Hague, Aug. 10, N. S. By Letters from Zealand there is Advice, that the Transports and Convoy, with the Troops and Stores for Oſtend, arrived happily in that Road laſt Saturday Evening, the 7th Inſtant. Advices from Flanders mention, that Five and twenty or thirty Battalions of French, with a conſiderable Train of Artillery, the whole under the Command of General Lowendal, are in March for Oſtend, in order to form the Siege of that Place; and the neighbouring Country was obliged to furniſh 5000 Pioneers for that Purpoſe. A Detachment of 600 Men, that was going from Antwerp by Water to throw itſelf into Dendermonde, has been obliged to return unſucceſſful, with the Loſs of a Eilander with ſome Dutch Troops. Major Harrel, who commanded the Detachment, was killed.

Oſtend, Auguſt 11. The Enemy have unmasked two Batteries, conſiſting of ſix Pieces of Cannon, three of which flank'd the Harbour, the other three the Quay and Paſſage out of Town; they kept a ſmart Fire for three Hours, but as they have not fir'd ſince Ten o'Clock this Morning, it is ſuppos'd a Battery of the Town has ſilenc'd them. We expect a ſtrong Fire from the Enemy by To-morrow Night or Friday Morning, as they are erecting a Bomb Battery about five hundred Yards from the Glacis.
