Susannah Bryant the Wife of John Bryant the Sum of one hundred
and fifty Pounds I give and bequeath to my Son Charles Field the
Sum of two hundred Pounds all which before mentioned Legacies I
do hereby order and direct to be paid within twelve months next after my
death by my Executors out of my Personal Property I do hereby order
and direct my Executors to pay to my said Daughter Ann the Sum
that I may happen to owe her at my death with lawful interest
thereon and also her pounds for our years wages next after my death
and the wages that may be due to her from the time we last settled
up to my death As to all the rest residue and remainder of my said
Personal Property after payment of my Debts Legacies Testamentary and
funeral Expenses I give and bequeath to my Sons Robert Field and
William Field in equal shares and proportions to and for their own
absolute use and benefit I give and direct to my said Son Robert Field
all that my freehold Blacksmiths Shop Grinding house Park and
Garden situated in the said Parish of St. Andrew to hold to him his heirs
and assigns for ever I give and bequeath to my said Son
William Field all those my two Copyhold Cottages and Premises next
adjoining my said Blacksmiths Shop in the possession of William
Donner and John Cooper to hold to him my said Son William
Field his heirs and assigns for ever I give and bequeath to my
Son John Field all that Copyhold Messuage Garden and Premises
situated in the aforesaid Parish of St. Andrew in the possession of George
Smart to hold to him my said Son John Field and his assigns for and
during the term of his natural life and from and immediately after his
death I do hereby give and bequeath the same Copyhold Messuage
and Premises unto my said Son Robert Field and William Field their heirs
and assigns for ever as Tenants in Common I give and bequeath to my
said Son Robert Field and William Field all that my Copyhold
Messuage Dwelling house and Premises situated in the said Parish of
St. Andrew adjoining the same to hold to them my said Son Robert
Field and William Field their heirs and assigns for ever in equal moieties
as Tenants in Common and not as joint Tenants subject nevertheless to and
with the annual payment or rent charge of five pounds of lawful
English Money to be paid half yearly and to commence from the first
of March day that may next happen after my death which I do hereby
give and bequeath to my said Son John Field or his assigns for and
during the term of his natural life with power to distrain for the same
in the same manner as now in arrears in respect the said annuity shall
remain due from day next after the day appointed for payment
thereof and from immediately after his death the said annual
